What funding is available?

Whether you're a big or small business, if you're hiring an apprentice, you can get help from the government to cover the costs of training. The amount you get depends on whether you pay the apprenticeship levy or not.

Apprenticeship Levy

You pay the levy if you're an employer with a pay bill over £3million. With the apprenticeship service you can manage funds for apprenticeship training, with a 10% government top-up and minimal costs if funds run low.

Levy Transfers

Levy-paying employers can transfer up to 50% of annual funds to support apprenticeship training for other employers, including smaller businesses.

Fully Funded for SME's

The government covers full training costs for apprentices in small businesses up to age 21.

£1,000 Cash Incentive

Eligible businesses hiring young apprentices could receive a £1000 bonus per apprentice.

Streamlined Payments

Hassle-free funding directly to training providers, allowing focus on nurturing apprentice talent.

CITB Grants

CITB provides grants for approved apprenticeship schemes focusing on core construction skills.
