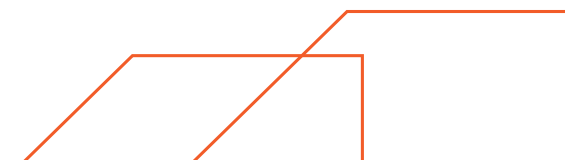


Cultivating meaningful collaborations between school and business:

The following table is designed to illustrate both the key functions of a Careers leader within a school or post 16 institution who is responsible for implementing the statutory careers duty, and examples of activities delivered by Enterprise Advisors supporting these institutions. This has been created as part of the Gateshead Building Education and Enterprise Partnership (BEEP) in response to consultations with both stakeholder groups.
